



innovative empathy-based learning on the deeply challenging issues of natural resource development through debate, negotiation and consensus building.


Empowering Canadians to Become Global Leaders

Without our many partners we wouldn't be able to IMPACT and REACH as many of the Canadians that we do through our programming.



























































UNA-Canada Revenue Types





































2016 Impressions at a Glance











